NATIONAL SEMINAR ON LINGUISTIC AND SOCIO-CULTURAL ASPECTS OF PROVERBS AND RIDDLES IN BANGLA AND DRAVIDIAN

The International School of Dravidian Linguistics organized a two-day national seminar on "Linguistic and Socio-Cultural Aspects of Proverbs and Riddles in Bangla and Dravidian" on 15th and 16th February 2024 at the seminar hall, Rabindra Bhavan in online and offline modes. The seminar focused on Linguistic and Socio-Cultural aspects of Proverbs and Riddles in Bangla and Dravidian languages. The inaugural session started at 10:00 A.M. with the welcome address by Dr. N. Muraleedharan Nair, Treasurer, ISDL. The Inaugural Address was delivered by Prof. V. Thiruvalluvan Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Tamil University, Thanjavur, and the Keynote Address was delivered by Prof. K. Karunakaran Former Vice Chancellor, Tamil University, Thanjavur & Chairman, ISDL. Dr. S. Abdul Samed, Secretary, ISDL proposed the vote of thanks.

The seminar commenced with an overview of Proverbs and Riddles which play a significant role in the Indian language and culture. At the seminar, the speakers offered unique perspectives on various aspects of Proverbs and Riddles in the Bangla and Dravidian languages.

The first academic session began at 10.30 A.M. with the presentation of a paper by Shri. Sourav Chakraborty, Guest Faculty, Jadavpur University on *A Linguistic Analysis of some Bengali Proverbs and Riddles*. In the paper he selected some Bengali proverbs and analyzed the morphemes.

Prof. S. Kavitha, HOD, School of Indian Languages and Comparative Literature, Tamil University, Thanjavur presented a paper entitled *A comparative study of the proverbs in Bengali and Tamil.* Her paper focused on a comparative study of Bengali and Tamil proverbs. The paper was aimed at highlighting the common Indianness or cultural substratum among Indian languages.

The second session started at 2.00 P.M. with the paper presentation by Dr. Sarmistha De Basu on sociocultural aspects of Bengali Proverbs and Riddles. She stated that Proverbs and Riddles are interpreted and negotiated with their pragmatic signification at linguistic, philosophical, and cultural levels. She also stated that the proverbs and idioms reflect the cultural identity of Bengali society.



The first session of the second day started at 10.00 A.M. with a paper presented by Prof. Aveek Majumdar, Department of Comparative Literature, Jadavpur University. The title of his paper was *Bengali Proverbs and Riddles*. He tried to justify the fact that proverbs and Riddles reflect the history of any society.

Prof. M. Rama, (Retd.), Dept. of Linguistics, University of Kerala presented a paper on *Proverbs in Kannada*. He stated that the Proverbs are short, pithy sayings that convey wisdom or advice based on common sense or experience. These sayings are typically handed down through generations and are used to teach moral values, cultural norms, and practical knowledge.

The last paper of this session was presented by Dr. Aiswaria G. Shajan, Research Fellow, at the International School of Dravidian Linguistics. She spoke on the *Cultural Evolution of 'The King of Jungle'*, *Kattunayakan*, providing valuable insights into the day-to-day life of this community. Her paper dealt with several sociocultural aspects of the Kattunayakan community.

The final session started at 2.15 P.M. through a paper presentation by Prof. N. Bhakthavathsala Reddy, Professor & Head (Retd.), Kakatiya University, Telangana on *Proverbs as Cultural Text with special reference to Telugu Proverbs*. The paper dealt with the concepts of 'Unit', 'Metaphor & Metonymy', and 'Cultural text'. For him Proverbs are short, memorable expressions that convey traditional wisdom or advice. They are rooted in cultural, social, and historical contexts, reflecting the experiences and observations of a community over time.

Each paper in the seminar was followed by lively discussions. This two-day national seminar was concluded with expression of gratitude by Dr. N. Muraleedharan Nair, Treasurer, ISDL.

Visalakshy unveiled the details of repositories of manuscripts in Kerala. In addition, she gave an overview of the ancient manuscripts of India. The second session began at 2 P.M. with the keynote address of Prof. G.K. Panikkar, Hon. Director, ISDL, on The Role of Linguistics in Editing Manuscripts'. The special lecture on "Mother Tongue, Multilingualism and NEP 2020" was organized by International School of Dravidian Linguistics on 1st March 2024 at Rabindra Bhawan. The event aimed to shed light on the importance of mother tongue, multilingualism in education, particularly in the context of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. Dr. Abdul Samed, Secretary, Dravidian Linguistics Association of India extended a warm welcome to the guests and delegates.

He emphasized the significance of discussing such crucial topics in the current educational landscape. Prof. G.K. Panikkar, Director, ISDL delivered the inaugural address, providing a comprehensive overview of the NEP 2020 and its implications for language education. SOCIOLINGUISTICS LECTURE SERIES

PROF. SHOBHA SATYANATH

The third lecture in the ISDL lecture series on Sociolinguistics by Prof. Shobha Satyanath, Former Professor, Dept. of Linguistics, University of Delhi was held online on 13th February 2024, at the Seminar Hall, Rabindra Bhavan, ISDL, Thiruvananthapuram. The topic of the lecture was 'Looking Beyond the West-Sociolinguistics Research in India: An Overview'. The lecture started at 10.30 A.M. with the welcome address by Arup Pandit. In this lecture Prof. Shobha Satyanath discussed the Sociolinguistic studies in India. She pointed out the importance of socio-linguistic studies while dealing with humans, human settlement, languages and the differences across linguistic ecologies and their socio-cultural structures. She highlighted the importance of factors such as urbanization, and other factors contributing to contact and change. She also discussed the various social parameters such as caste, clan, gender and matriarchy. Many researchers and senior linguists from different parts of India and abroad had attended the lecture. The interactive and informative lecture came to an end with the vote of thanks proposed by Ms. Aniu B.

The fourth lecture in the series 'Sociolinguistics: Parameters of Variation' by Prof. Shobha Satyanath was held on 20th February 2024, at 10.30 A.M. Ms. Anju B. welcomed Prof. Shobha Satyanath and other delegates. In this lecture, Prof. Shobha Satyanath mainly addressed the parameters of variation with a focus on standardness. She discussed how the label sociolinguistics implies connections between language and society. She also discussed standard and non-standard languages, diglossia and standardness, Fishman's model of bilingualism etc. The lecture came to an end with the vote of thanks proposed by Dr. Soumya S.R.

The fifth and the last lecture in the series on Sociolinguistics was held on 6th March 2024. The topic of the lecture was 'Researching Sociolinguistics: Data and Methods'. The lecture started with the welcome address by Mr. D. Mano. Prof. Shobha Satyanath dealt with the three main threads of researching a speech community viz., what do you research? How do you research? and What do you get out of such research? She discussed the salient points of sociolinguistics methodology, about speech community and how to study a speech community. She also discussed the conversational modules for interviews, do's and don'ts ethics and how to monitor recordings of an interview. The lecture came to an end with the vote of thanks proposed by Dr. N. Muraleedharan Nair, Treasurer, ISDL.
