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50™ AICDL AND INTERNATIONAL SEMINAR ON CURRENT TRENDS IN LINGUISTICS (Report)

(Continued from the October issue)

The third day (23-6-2023) of the 50th All India Conference of Dravidian Linguists and International Seminar on Current Trends in Linguistics organized by the Department of Linguistics, University of Kerala, in collaboration with the Dravidian Linguistic Association of India, International School of Dravidian Linguistics, and Central Institute of Indian Languages, Mysuru, commenced in the main venue, Conference Hall of the Department of Aquatic Biology and Fisheries, University of Kerala at 9 A.M. with Prof. S.K. Verma Memorial Lecture. The lecture was delivered by Prof. B.N. Patnaik (Retd. Professor of English and Linguistics, Dept. of Humanities and Social Sciences, Indian Institute of Technology, Kanpur) in online mode and chaired by Dr.V. Syamala (Retd. Professor, Institute of English, University of

Kerala). The lecture was centered on the core aspects of language and culture. Prof. Patnaik elaborated on the various aspects of language and culture and saw social hierarchy as a consequence of cultural hierarchy. This memorial lecture ended at 10 A.M. with extending gratitude to Prof. B.N. Patnaik and Prof. V.Syamala for making the session a great success. Then the parallel sessions in the corresponding venues started at 10.30 A.M. The following technical sessions were held at various venues:

1. Technical Session: Conference Hall, Dept. of Aquatic **Biology & Fisheries**

The first technical session was chaired by Dr. V. Renuga Devi (Retd. Professor and former Chairperson of the School of Linguistics and Communication at Madurai Kamaraj

University). The following papers were brought for discussion: Ms. Kavita Yadav presented a paper on End Matters: Critical Discourse Analysis of Language Used in Reporting Death. The paper adheres to the analytic paradigm of Critical Discourse Analysis (CDA) conducted on a corpus of texts published in the Hindustan Times newspaper to report the deaths of celebrities, sampled on two broad characteristics manner of death and the public image of the deceased. Atheena Moolampally presented her paper on Linguistic Profiling of Schizophrenia: Case Study in Malayalam. The author attempted to study the writings of schizophrenic patients in comparison with the writings of others. Adithi E.P., in her paper titled Influence of Social Media on Lexicalization of New Words and Adding New Meaning to the Existing Words during the Covid period, collected possible number of Malayalam trending words and showed the media's influence in popularizing these words. The next presentation was by Ashams Joe on A study analyzing how social media use Language to appeal to curiosity and exploit the emotional reflex of modern society. This study aimed to analyze the Language of social media to understand how it is manipulated to exploit social media users' curiosity and emotional reflexes and the impact it can have on them. Mrs. Ilfa K.M. presented a paper on Near-Synonymous Divine Names in the Holy Qur'an: A Semantic Analysis of Al-Asma Al-Husna

and their translations. The paper examined the paradigmatic semantic relationship of synonymy in the Divine Names of Allah in Islam, referred to as 'Al Asma Al Husna, a special group of ninety-nine most beautiful names. Each of these names indicates a divine attribute of Allah and describes the God in Islam. This was followed by a presentation by Miss. Anisha Stephen on Language of Teaching Materials for Intellectually Disabled Children in Kerala: A Study Based on Linguistic Aspects, which analyzed and evaluated the teaching materials prepared by SCERT (State Council of Educational Research and Training) for primary-level intellectually disabled children in Kerala. Mr. Leo W. Simon & Dr. Darwin L. presented a paper on the Significance of Gender-Neutral Language in Translation: A Study Based on Holy Scripture (NRSV). This paper analyzes the 'Gender-Neutral language' used by the NRSV Bible translators. The last paper in this session was by Mr. Aleendra Brahma on the title Sesquisyllables in NEI languages: The Endangered Elements. The paper was very informative for the understanding of endangered Tibeto-Burman and Austro-Asiatic Languages. The session ended at 12.10 P.M.




