1. **Mrs. Katre Memorial Prize** for M.A. topper in Linguistics (2020-2022 batch), of ₹ 2000/-. (The Universities and Heads of Departments are requested to forward mark lists of eligible candidates.)

2. **Award for the Best Paper in the Conference** by a young full-time student or research scholar, of ₹ 2000/-. (Only bona fide students and full-time research scholars, who have produced certificates from their respective Heads of Departments stating their student status, can take part in the competition.)

3. **Prof. K. Anbazhakan Award** for Translation of *Tolkappiyam* in any international language, of ₹ 3000/-. The book should have been published within a period of 3 years before **1st May 2022**.

4. **Award for the Best Monograph on Dravidian Tribes**, of ₹ 3000/-. It should have been published within a period of 3 years before **1st May 2022**.

10. **Dr. Panneerselvam & Smt. Thavamani Panneerselvam Award** for the Translation of a Book from Tamil to Kannada or vice versa. The award amount is ₹ 5000/-. The book should have been published within a period of 3 years before *1st May 2022*.

Introductory Note by Prof. Naduvattom Gopalakrishnan, Hon. Director, ISDL

Dear Distinguished delegates,

Dravidian Linguistic Association of India beholds a vision to promote the Dravidian language studies and to unite scholars who are engaged/interested in Dravidian studies. It was founded on 13th August 1971 under the chairmanship of Prof. S. K. Chatterji. In 1977 the International School of Dravidian Linguistics came in to being at Menamkulam, Thiruvananthapuram. In order to get best research outputs, the ISDL provides maximum facilities with the assistance of scholars from the area of linguistics, sociolinguistics, Information Technology, Tribal Studies, Anthropology etc. DLA and ISDL have a publication unit working with utmost efficiency for publishing research works. So far, 147 books were published by this unit. From 1971 January onwards 'International Journal of Dravidian Linguistics', a renowned journal in linguistics having circulation in almost all the major countries of the world was brought out. ISDL library is one among the most prominent libraries of India comprising very valuable works on Dravidian languages, Sanskrit, Linguistics, Indian Philosophy, Culture, Epigraphy etc. Now this library has nearly 37,000 books on various disciplines. The determination and hard work of the founder and soul of ISDL Prof. V. I. Subramoniam paved the way for the establishment of Dravidian University. Throughout the 50 years of its service, DLA provides invaluable research results in the field of linguistics. No language is greater than the other language. Every language is playing a pivotal role in human civilization. This realization is the soul strength of Dravidian Linguistics Association of India.

Our 48th All India Conference of Dravidian Linguists is going to be inaugurated here by observing the restrictions stipulated due to Covid 19 pandemic situation. Really, the 48th AICDL was scheduled in the year 2020. Either in 2020 or in 2021 we could not conduct it due to Covid related restrictions. The present Chairman of the Governing Council

of ISDL Prof. K. Karunakaran came forward to organize this Conference at Kovai with the collaboration of Bharathiyar University. Central Institute of Indian Languages, Mysuru has also collaborated with us to conduct this AICDL here. We are thankful to Dr. Karunakaran Krishnamoorthy the former V.C of Tamil University and Prof. P. Kaliraj, Hon. Vice Chancellor of Bharathiyar University and Dr. V. M. Subramoniam, H.O.D of Linguistics, Bharathiyar University, Prof. Shailendra Mohan, Director CIIL, for taking the initiatives to conduct this conference here. I also thank the authorities of the Central Institute of Indian Languages, Mysore for their collaboration in this Conference. I take this opportunity to convey our greetings on behalf of DLA and ISDL to Prof. R. Kathiresan, Hon. Vice Chancellor, Annamalai University and to Prof. V. Thiruvalluvan, Hon. Vice Chancellor, Tamil University, Tanjavur.

Kovai is well known in history as a centre of famous Institutions and Industry. Legends say that Kovai, the chief of Irula community, ruled certain parts of the present Kovai by making Puthur as his capital and later this land was known as Kovaiputtur. Another version of the name is related to the tale of Koniamman the ruling deity of Coimbatore. Towards the dawn of 9th century C. E, Coimbatore and its surrounding areas came to be known as Kongunadu. It became a vital trade route and came under the dominion of many powerful dynasties including the Cheras and the Cholas at various points of time. In Kerala the residents of Chittoor annually celebrate the festival 'Konganpada' which reveals the suzerainty of Kongu Cholas in certain border areas of Palakkad district. A 15th century Malayalam epic namely *Kṛṣṇagāthā* had a reference to clothes imported from Kovanputtur i.e., the present Coimbatore. We are blessed to have this Conference of the Dravidian Linguistics Association in this historic city.

Several annual conferences of DLA were conducted at different Universities of South India and in North like Delhi, Kolkata, Patiala etc. I bow my head before the memories of Prof. V. I. Subramoniam, Prof. Sunitikumar Chatterji, Prof. R. C. Hiremath, Prof. Mahadeva Sastri, Prof. T. P. Meenakshi Sundaram, Prof. G.J. Resolutions

Following resolutions were passed in the 48th AICDL:-

1. Provide teacher training opportunities for M.A. students of linguistics to ensure teaching oriented jobs at the

school levels to promote Dravidian languages and strengthen mother tongue based teaching education.

2. Introduce M.A. Dravidian linguistics courses in the universities through the integrated mode with DLA.
3. Conducting annual Dravidian linguistics conference with workshop for M.A. students focusing on comparative and contrastive studies in the Dravidian Languages.
4. Introducing writing courses in Dravidian languages for the benefit of the students of science graduates in bringing out text books and to prepare materials for the use of students at different levels (like *arivial tamil*, *arivial moli* etc.)
5. Recommend M.A. Linguistics degree as a desirable course in the areas of judicial, administrative and legislative jobs.
6. Request the Central Institute of Indian Languages (CIIL) to publish selected papers (including endowment lectures) presented in the DLA annual conference after peer reviewing in the form of a book.
7. Conduct summer and winter schools in Dravidian Linguistics periodically every year in different parts of the country and provide academic and financial support by organizations like CIIL, ICSSR, Ministry of Tribal Affairs and Ministry of Culture for the major and minor languages of Dravidian.
