A Man with extra ordinary brilliance and foresight

Dr. Naduvattom Gopalakrishnan is a highly reputed Malayalam Linguist Historian and a scholarly writer in Kerala. Born in 3.2.1951 at Naduvattom in Alappuzha district in Kerala. Gopalakrishnan completed P.G. course in Malayalam Language and Literature in 1972 underwent Linguistic studies at the Department of Linguistics, University of Kerala. He took Ph.D. Degree under the supervision of Dr. V.I Subrahmoniam, an internationally reputed linguist. Gopalakrishnan's research was on the early phase of Malayalam Language with special reference to Rāmacaritam, the earliest known classical poem in Malayalam.

Naduvattom Gopalakrishnan entered in College Education service of Government of Kerala in July 1976 as lecturer and retired as Deputy Director of Collegiate Education in 2006. After his retirement he continued his research in Malayalam Linguistics in International School of Dravidian Linguistics, Thiruvananthapuram. He continues there as Hon. Professor. He was UGC Emeritus Fellow at the Department of Malayalam, University of Kerala from 2013-16. He was the convener of the expert committee constituted by the Government of Kerala for the preparation of an exhaustive report on the eligibility of Malayalam for the Classical status. Malayalam was declared as a Classical language by the Government of India in 2013.Naduvattom Gopalakrishnan extended his service as a special officer to enquire and report the problems of Linguistic Minorities in Kerala. He submitted the report in 2019.

Main achievements

1. Report on the eligibility of Malayalam for getting the classical status

The antiquity of the language, the richness of its literature and as an integrated pluralistic civilization which has evolved in Kerala, where Malayalam is spoken. It has a unique harmony of antiquity and modernity. This language has a continuous history of more than 2000 years. It belongs to the family of Dravidian languages having a legacy of ancient and modern literary works of high standard. Malayalam is the mother of the visual arts like Kūṭiyāṭṭam and

Kathakali. It is in Malayalam that Kautalya's Arthaśāstra got its elaborate interpretation and translation after its composition in Sanskrit language.

Highlighting all these aspects, Dr. Naduvattom Gopalakrishnan prepared the monograph 'Malayalam as a Classical Language'. Malayalam developed and popularised its characteristic linguistic features even before the Sangam Period. Gopalakrishnan identified the following stages which demarcate the distinct classical features of the language with its subsequent forms

- 1. Proto Malayalam Classical period up to 800 C.E.
- 2. Early Malayalam Classical period 800-1300 C.E.
- 3. Medieval Malayalam Classical period 1300-1600 C.E.
- 4. Modern Malayalam 1600 CE onwards

2. Origin of Malayalam Language

Naduvattom Gopalakrishnan put forth the following theory on the origin of Malayalam Language, which got wide recognition among linguistic scholars.

"There was a common stage for Tamil and Malayalam in the course of their development which can be called 'Proto Tamil Malayalam.' Later the west coast dialect of Proto Tamil Malayalam developed as Malayalam and the east coast dialect of Proto Tamil Malayalam developed on Modern Tamil."

3. Author of 39 Malayalam books and 6 English books.

These books cover the topics like Malayalam Linguistics; Dravidian Linguistics; Ancient literary genres of Malayalam; Kerala history; Kerala inscriptions; Folklore; Phonological and Morphological studies on early Tamil and Malayalam literary works; Linguistic archaeology; Place names; Kerala culture; Descriptive studies on early and medieval works in Malayalam; Evolution of Malayalam language; Grammatical treatises in Tamil and Malayalam; Interpretations of early and Medieval classical works in Malayalam; Biographical literature; Scripts of Kerala; Loan words in

Malayalam; Bhakti movements in South India; Description on Upaniṣads and Sāstras and History of Malayalam Language.
